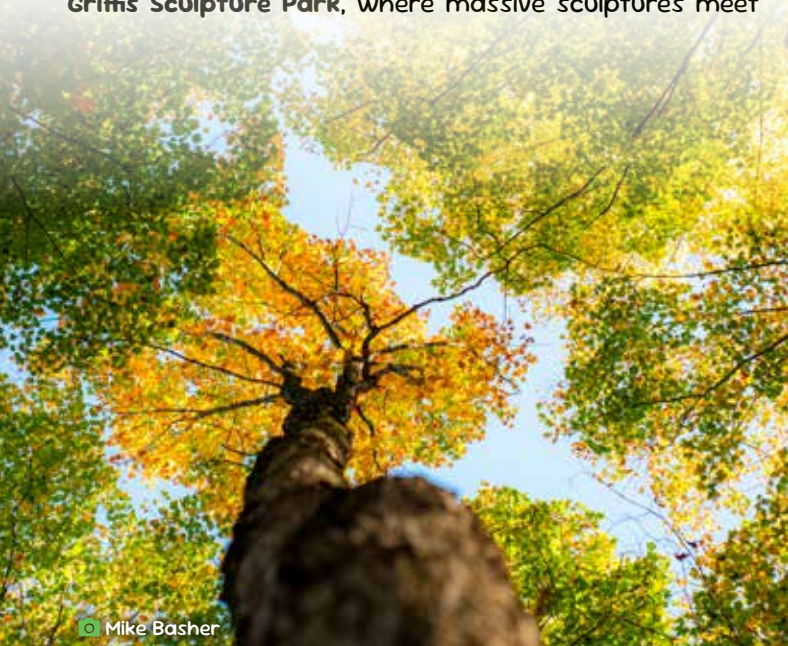

New York's Largest State Park lies right in **Salamanca's** backyard and offers a multitude of year-round, outdoor activities. The **two sections of the park, Red House Area and Quaker Area**, offer natural adventures for those seeking to explore the great outdoors.

The **Art Roscoe Trail System** features 24 miles of interconnecting loop trails. These trails are some of the **best single-track and double-track mountain biking and cross-country skiing in Western NY**. There are miles of other trails, perfect for hiking, horseback riding, mountain biking, snowmobiling, cross-country skiing and snowshoeing.

In the summer months, enjoy Red House and Quaker Lakes. Whether you like to swim, fish, kayak, or just relax on the sandy beach, there's something for everyone.

Spend time **picnicking with your family**, playing basketball, tennis, horseshoes, and volleyball with friends, or just letting the children spend time on one of the playgrounds.

Whether you're yearning to be surrounded by wilderness and not much more, or you simply want

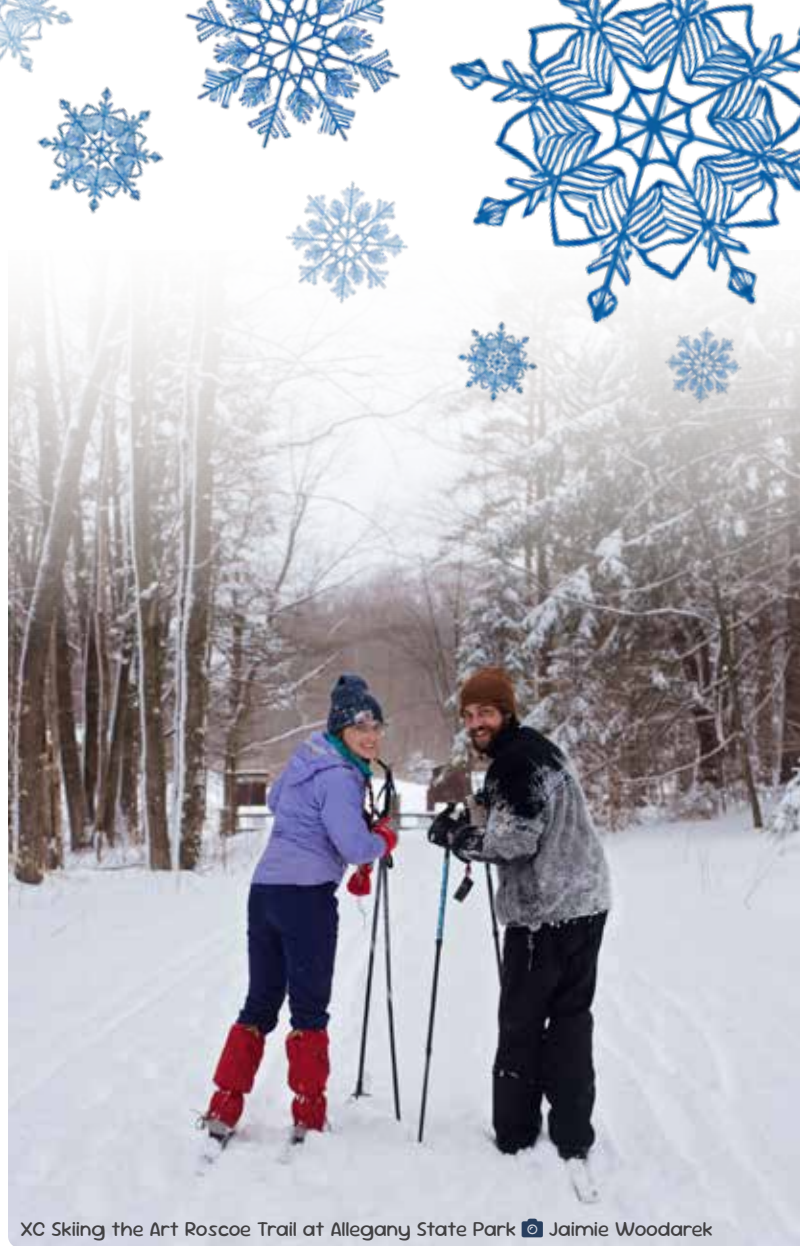
Art Roscoe Trail System

Known for its scenic beauty, the **Art Roscoe Trail System** is widely considered the best cross country ski trails in Western New York and Northeastern Pennsylvania with approximately 24 miles of trails, groomed on an as-needed basis, all of which **begin at the Summit Warming Hut** in Allegany State Park. The trail system features a variety of difficulty levels.

Winter cabins may be available within a short walk of the Art Roscoe trailhead but be sure to book in advance.

Snow tubing is a thrilling winter activity and fun for the whole family!

Holiday Valley Tubing Company is a 22-lane tubing park where visitors can slide down the snow-covered hills in large, inflatable tubes. The park offers a variety of lanes for all skill levels, including some with faster, steeper runs and others that are more relaxed.

Snowshoe

Check out the **"Bear Paw" Trail** at **Allegheny State Park**, a great place to start a snowshoeing adventure. It will lead you behind the Summit Area and towards Stone Tower.

Pfeiffer Nature Center has over **nine miles** of trails between its two properties, Eshelman and Lillibridge. These free trails

are open from dawn to dusk year-round and provide everything from short, level walks to long, rugged climbs through deep woods and open meadows, near creeks and ponds, and past plenty of great wildlife habitats. Remember the Eshelman property is closed from October through December for hunting season.

Have a flurry of fun on nearly **450 miles of snowmobile trails** that weave paths throughout the county, into Allegany State Park, and connect with the 10,000 miles of New York State snowmobile trails.

Ice Fishing

Allegany State Park's **Quaker and Red House lakes** are premier destinations for ice fishing, drawing "hard-water" enthusiasts from across the region.

Other popular local "hot spots" include **Lime, Case, New Albion, and Harwood Lakes**.

To ensure a rewarding experience, the DEC Randolph Fish Hatchery stocks these waters annually during the spring and fall with surplus broodstock.

Cattaraugus Creek stands as a premier destination for high-octane river sports, featuring **exhilarating Class III and IV rapids** that challenge both rafters and kayakers. The adventure peaks during the early spring thaw (mid-March through May) and returns with the autumn rains, providing the ideal water levels for "hard-water" fans to transition into the surf.

Because these waters are as demanding as they are beautiful, safety is the top priority. All paddlers are required to wear appropriate safety gear at all times. To ensure a rewarding experience tailored specifically to your group's skill level, we recommend booking through local experts.

For those who prefer a smooth, paved experience, **Allegheny State Park** provides over **10 miles of designated trails**, including a scenic 3.1-mile loop around Red House Lake and an additional 5.2-mile path through the Quaker side of the park.

Another excellent choice is the **Allegheny River Valley Trail**, a **10-foot-wide asphalt loop that stretches 6.2 miles** through the City of Olean and around **St. Bonaventure University**. This trail features numerous benches with peaceful river views, and those without their own gear can easily rent bikes at **Twist 'n Shake**, located right on the path.

For a longer, more rustic adventure, the **Pat McGee Trail** follows a historic 1851 rail line, offering **12 miles of multi-use** scenic riding through the countryside.

If you prefer the open road, the winding country lanes of the area provide spectacular views and varying levels of difficulty. Several popular routes begin and end at the **Inn at Holiday Valley**, such as the Ellicottville–West Valley Loop, a moderate **38-mile journey** through rolling terrain. Shorter options include the **21-mile Beaver Meadows route**, which involves 875 feet of climbing, and the

Little Valley variation, a **31-mile ride** that lets you choose between a gentle finish on Dublin Meadows Road or a grueling, steep ascent up the legendary "Murder Hill." For the truly ambitious, the Dutch Hill route presents a significant challenge: a **45-mile ride** featuring three major hills and 2000 feet of total climbing.

For those needing technical assistance or looking for a community to ride with,

Upcycle Bicycles in Olean (716-375-7178) offers expert maintenance and hosts weekly group rides. Whether you are navigating the paved loops of the state parks or tackling the hills of Ellicottville, the region's cycling infrastructure ensures a memorable experience for all.

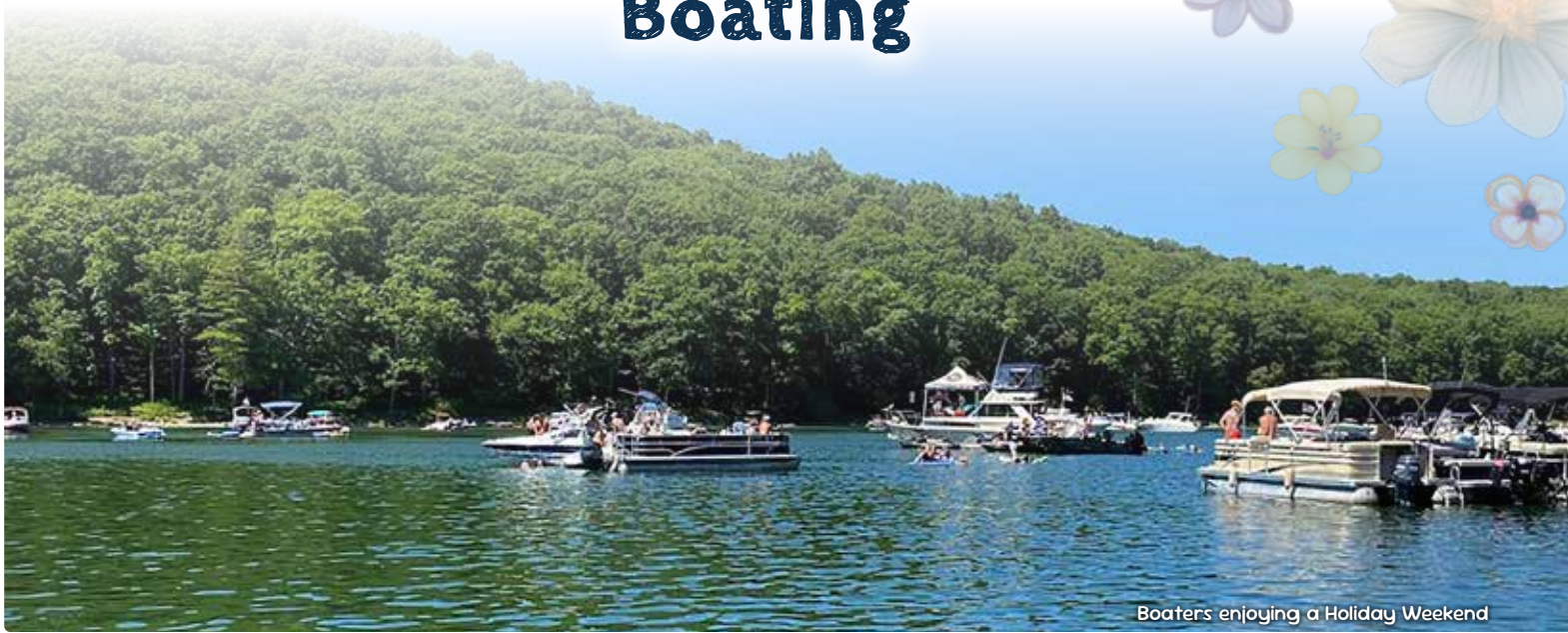

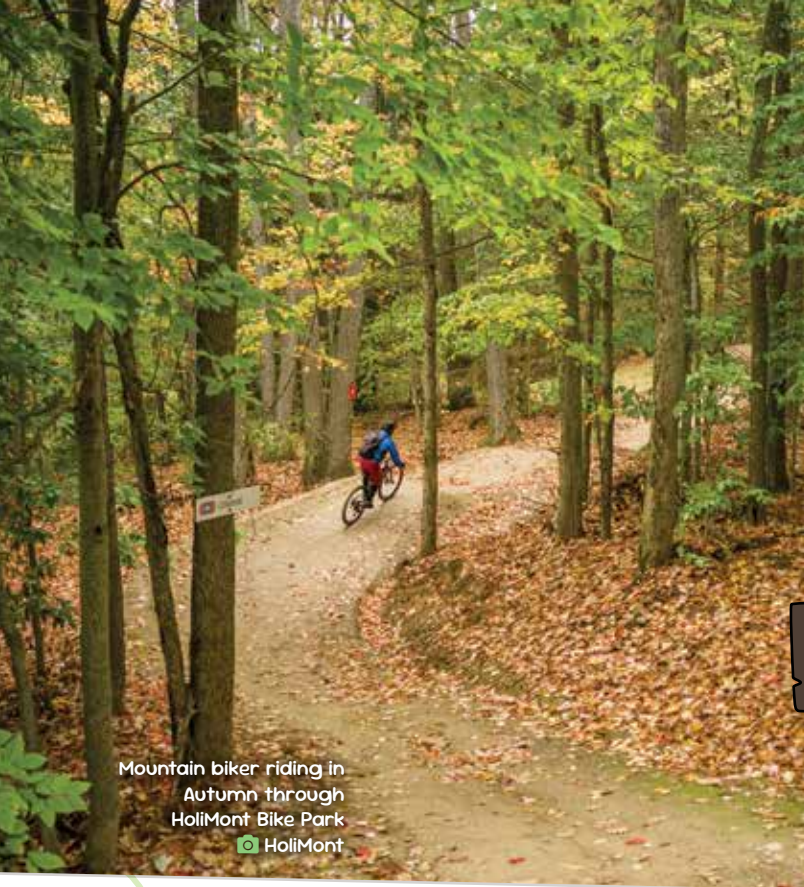

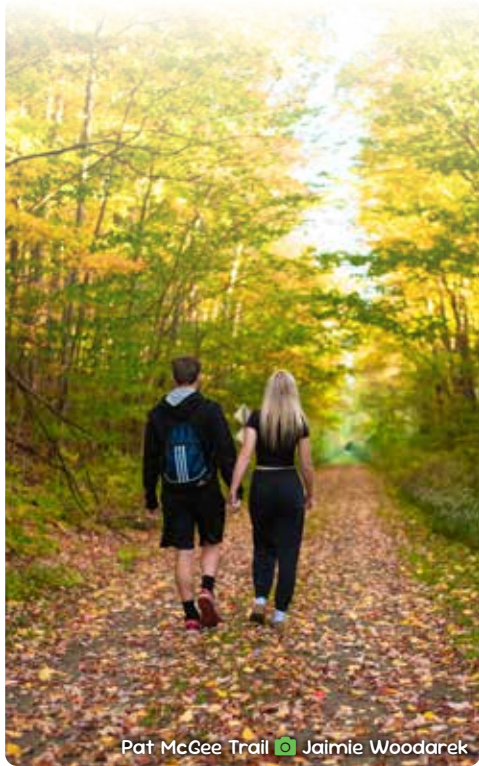

Traveling throughout Western New York you will witness the beauty of the Allegheny Mountains as the hills roll endlessly. You can hear the peaceful water flowing down the **Allegheny River** or the rapids of the mighty **Cattaraugus Creek**. Nestled in this serene landscape is the **home of a Native Nation known as the Onöndowa'ga:'**, the people of the great hill, or by their English name, **the Seneca**.

Historically, the Seneca occupied territory throughout the Finger Lakes area in Central New York, and in the Genesee Valley in Western New York, living in longhouses on the riversides. The Seneca were the largest of six Native American nations which comprised the Haudenosaunee Confederacy or Six Nations, a democratic government that pre-dates the U.S. Constitution.

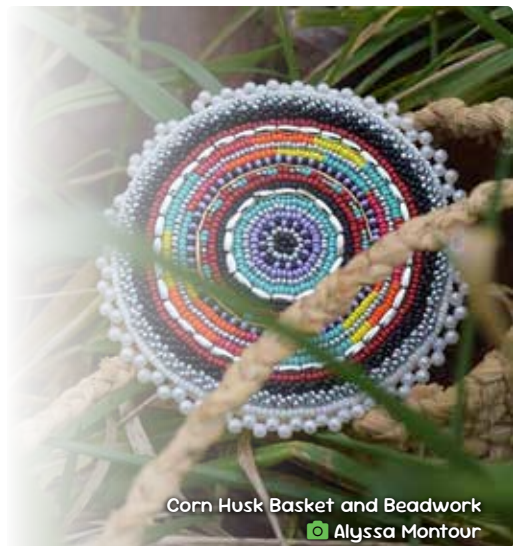
Today, the **Seneca Nation has a population over 8,500 members**. The Seneca Nation supports its people and benefits surrounding communities with a variety of cultural, educational and economic efforts.


Throughout the year, the Seneca Nation hosts events that will surely bring a positive learning experience for the entire family to enjoy. In the springtime, make a trip to our **Ohi:yo' Art Market** and gaze upon the handmade beauty that visually represents our proud culture from all around Indian Country. During

the summer listen to the beat of the drums, the harmonious voices and see the elegant foot work of dancers at the **Marvin "Joe" Curry Veterans Pow Wow**. Experience their take on food security and food sovereignty through community engagement and wellness by implementing a Haudenosaunee approach to agricultural practices at the **Gakwi:yo:h Farms**. Products and produce from the farm are available for purchase right at the farm and at the Seneca One Stop truck stops and convenience stores; located throughout Western New York and the Southern Tier!

During your visit, be sure to stop by the **Onöhsagwë:de' Cultural Center** - home of the Seneca Iroquois National Museum, housing Haudenosaunee history. Here, you will find history to take with you, crafts, jewelry, and so much more that shows the beauty of the Seneca Nation culture. Stay at **Highbanks Campground**, overlooking the Allegany Reservoir. Utilize the boat ramp and dock during your stay and bring those water toys! Don't forget to bring your frisbee's and play on the new champion- rated disc golf course! Highbanks Campground is open all year. Enjoy the comforts of their cabins, relax in your RV, or pitch a tent and sleep under the stars.

When visiting sacred sites or grounds please respect the old structures, do not remove any artifacts, and be cautious of the landscaping and vegetation in the area as Nation and Federal law prohibit the removal or desecration of such items.

When attending powwows and socials please honor the traditions and witness the event as a spectator. Please approach dancers and singers respectfully and ask permission to take photos and/or video.

THE HOME OF THE SENECA-IROQUOIS NATIONAL MUSEUM



The **Onöhsagwë:dé Cultural Center** in Salamanca, is truly a place you need to experience. The impressive facility houses the **Seneca-Iroquois National Museum**, and has components of an educational facility, living culture elements, and performance spaces.

The Cultural Center is named after Richard "Onöhsagwë:dé" Johnny-John. "Onöhsagwë:dé" means "an opening in the house." He spent his whole life on the Allegany Territory, dedicating many years to preserving Seneca history and culture by becoming a bilingual specialist for the Seneca Nation.

The Cultural Center brings ample space and the technology needed to bring some of the Seneca artifacts home and properly care for them.

95% of Seneca artifacts have never been on display due to their delicate nature.

A classroom is available for groups and **educational tours**. Students can be guided through the museum and then come back to the classroom for more educational videos and lectures and a chance to ask Cultural Specialists specific questions they may have.

The **interactive and informational exhibits** tell the history of the Seneca, from The Creation Story to present day. Other exhibits include a welcoming "Gustoweh," The Clan System, a log cabin that visitors can walk through, Seneca Women, Arts and Sports, The Kinzua Dam Project. While there are opportunities to touch or listen to certain components of these exhibits, tours are also available and highly recommended.

There is an amphitheater in the back of the building to host events.

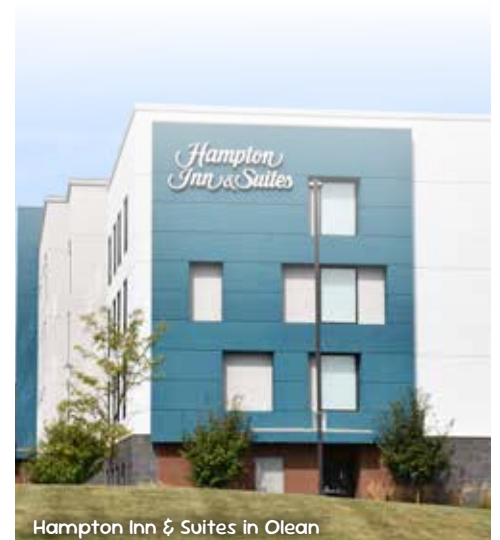

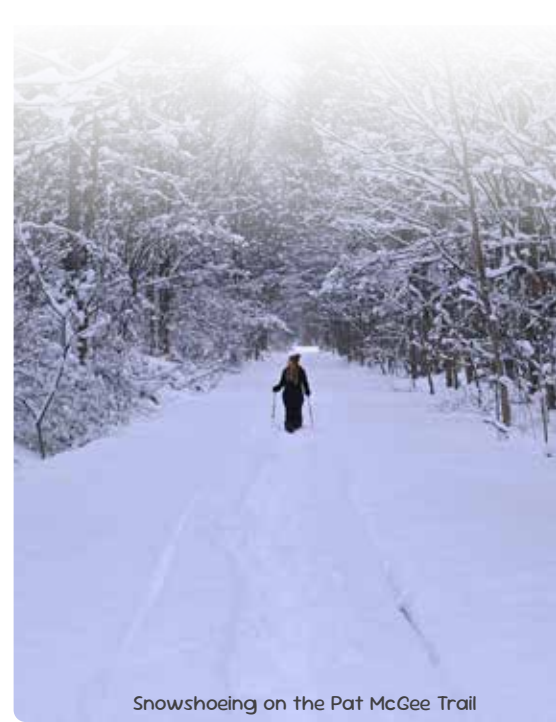
